Wastewater Project

The City of Dufur completed phase one of the wastewater project in December of 2023. This portion of the project update the existing wastewater effluent center pivot irrigation system and to remove sewage sludge from the wastewater treatment lagoon, Cell No. 1.

Phase two of the wastewater system improvements project started back in the Summer of 2024 and is set for completion in the next couple months.

The Cities Wastewater Treatment Facility located East of Hogans Alley just beyond the pool. The old wastewater system had the city irrigating in the summer months and discharged in to Fifteen Mile Creek in the winter months. With the new improvements to the wastewater system, the city will now have two new treatment cells, a large holding pond, new chlorination building, and the city purchased new land to create a second pivot for irrigation. With the purchase of the new land the city will no longer discharge in the winter months to Fifteen Mile Creek

On behalf of the City of Dufur, I would like to thank you for your patience during the construction of the Wastewater Facility. The improvements that we are making will serve the city for many years to come.

Dufur Fire and EMS: New Ambulance Coming Soon

Dufur Fire and EMS is preparing to take delivery of a new ambulance that will soon serve our community and surrounding rural areas. This much-needed replacement will help ensure reliable emergency response across 648 square miles, in all weather conditions.

The department responds to about 130 calls each year and has been working hard to update aging equipment to keep pace with the needs of our residents. The State of Oregon awarded a \$200,000 grant to support this project, and the new ambulance is nearly ready for delivery.

However, the total cost of the vehicle exceeds the grant funding, and about \$92,000 remains unpaid. The city is asking for community support to help close that gap so the new ambulance can be fully paid for and placed into service as soon as possible.

Burn Permits

Permits are required for all open burn piles and burn barrels. All previously issued burn permits have expired. You will need to obtain a new burn permit this year at Dufur City Hall.

Burn permits are only valid for the date issued to the following June 15 of the next year or when the burn ban goes into effect.

Cost for new burn permit is \$5.00

It's FireMed Renewal Season!

FireMed Memberships help cover the cost of ambulance transport, which often isn't fully paid by insurance. For just \$60 a year, your membership covers ground ambulance transportation for everyone in your household and supports Dufur's all-volunteer EMS team. Funds stay local to help maintain equipment and training. FireMed members are also covered in more than 50 partner communities across Oregon, including The Dalles, Hood River, Moro, and Maupin.

Automatic renewals will process on **December 30, 2025**, so please either confirm your auto-renewal status **or sign up for your 2026 membership by January 1, 2026** to ensure continuous coverage. New members and renewals can sign up anytime at dufurfiremed.com. Memberships purchased now are valid January through December 2026.

Ordinance: Parking

At the Dufur City Council meeting on September 9th the Council voted to pass the amended chapter 72 regarding parking on city Right-of-Way. Parking on a city's right-of-way is generally governed by rules that include requiring vehicles to park parallel to the curb, within 12 inches of the edge, and facing the direction of traffic, unless otherwise posted. Common prohibitions include unregistered vehicles, expired tags, parking on sidewalks, in front of driveways, near fire hydrants or crosswalks, and double parking. The ordinance also amends the parking regulations to allow for the towing of abandoned, discarded and inoperable vehicles in conformance with the Oregon Vehicle Code. North and south running streets are 60-foot right-of-way while east and west running streets are 40 feet right-of-way; 1st street and 5th street are exceptions, with 60-foot rights-of-way. Dufur Recreation District Receives Oregon State Parks & Recreation Grant

Dufur City Park is happy to announce the opening of our new Splash Pad, completed halfway through the 2025 swim season – it was very well enjoyed this summer! With projected opening as early May running through most of September – it gives the children of Dufur and beyond a fun way to beat the heat and make the most out of our summer weather. Splash Pads provide fun, free, exciting play for kids of all ages. Access to imaginative free play leads to smarter, happier and healthier children and families.

Dufur Recreation District received a \$440,979 grant award from the Oregon Parks & Recreation Department's Local Government Grant Program. The district coupled the \$200,000 from Wasco County ARPA Funds with the grant funds to install the splash pad and make ADA improvements to the bathhouse and parking area to allow for greater access for all.

Dufur Pool has been frequented for generations by the community's residents and visitors. The Pool brings community members from the area together to play and exercise. With many families located in the area, the Dufur Recreation District is happy to be able to continue to provide this service to the community.

OPRD currently awards about \$15 million annually to Oregon communities for outdoor recreation projects, and has awarded over \$100 million in grants across the state since 1999. The grants are funded from voter-approved Lottery money. In the 2025 grant cycle, OPRD awarded over \$15,000,000 in large grants to 22 entities; the cycle includes matching funds of \$19,720,900 for projects totaling \$34,720,900!

Dufur Recreation District's mission is to enrich the quality of life for the Dufur community by preserving and enhancing recreational opportunities and open space. This grant project improves the recreational water facilities for today, and helps preserve it for future generations.

Even with medical insurance, the average \$2,164+ expense of ambulance rides is rarely covered in full. By becoming a Dufur FireMed Member, you don't need to worry about the cost of ambulance rides and what your medical insurance will or will not cover. Also, if you work or play outside of Dufur, you will receive the same benefits in 50 other regions throughout Oregon, including in Clatsop, Hood River, Moro, Maupin and more.

Your \$60 annual membership fee stays in Dufur. All funds received go toward training and equipment for the local service. This helps the all-volunteer Dufur EMS team provide quality pre-hospital care and transportation.

Your membership provides coverage for all persons who are permanent residents of the same single-occupancy, non-commercial residence. All memberships expire at the end of the calendar year, at which time all members will be invited to renew their membership for the next year.

NOTE: This Dufur FireMed membership DOES NOT include LifeFlight Air transportation. You must purchase LifeFlight Air transportation membership separately by calling 1-800-982-9299.
